

Supplementary Table 3: Illustrative quotes on present-day emotional impact.

- a. "I don't feel comfortable when I get out of the swimming pool as my whole arms turn red and I start scratching my whole skin." (17-year-old patient, Saudi Arabia)
- b. "It kills me when I see the child suffering the itchiness and scratching."
(Male caregiver of 5-year-old patient, China)
- c. "The aesthetic part never really worried me; it was really just the redness and scratching that affected him and made him constantly move. It was uncomfortable seeing that he was not comfortable. I mean, I could take a shower, it might have been a cool day, and he was still uncomfortable [...], and that was the last thing I wanted." (Female caregiver of 9-year-old patient, Portugal)
- d. "More and more my son is ashamed of having dermatitis on his feet [...] I want to go to a dermatologist for help, I don't want that to affect him emotionally." (Female caregiver of 11-year-old patient, Spain)
- e. "It's always difficult to say 'no' to my child whenever she craves something that flares up any of her symptoms." (Female caregiver of 8-year-old patient, Saudi Arabia)
- f. "It is tiring as a mother. I know that babies need extra care at this age, but she needs even more. I hate when I give her older sister a certain type of food, but I'm not able to give her the same type. I sense that she gets disturbed." (Female caregiver of 1-year-old patient, Saudi Arabia)
- g. "I get annoyed from the fact that she can't eat the things she likes."
(Female caregiver of 11-year-old patient, Saudi Arabia)

- h. "He has difficulties managing the pen, so in school, they suggest for him to use the laptop instead. He didn't agree, as he didn't want to look different from his colleagues. He thought the idea was ridiculous." (Male caregiver of 16-year-old patient, Portugal)
